INTRODUCTION

The content of this report is a complete narrative Sunginning of the Extension program in Goobhland County for the beginning of the year 1931, containing the aims and goals of the program; the degree of accomplishment and the expectations of various items not recorded in the statistical proport.

The County's Extension organization is composed of four Community organizations, the officers or committemen of which, form the advisory board.

The policy of the committees is to advocate and encourage such practices as will improve the soil; the quality of production and give the farmer greater return for his labor. It further encourages more diversified agriculture; the suplementing of the one-crop farming system with one that will insure an income should one individual crop fail. It stresses the value of dairying, poultry, hogs and sheep, as alternatives for a part of their previous crops. It cooperates closely with the farm men and women for economical production and orderly marketing of their products. It further encourages the boys and girls through 4-ff Club work, to take an active part in improving farm practices, establishing a cooperative spirit and community building.

The Agent feels that this method of doing Extension work is most successful and effective.

The Committees have made their plan or work for this year and made a survey of their individual committee to judge just. what was needed in the way of Extension work. They have taken for their main project; legumes, gardens and 4-H Club work to meet the emergency food and feed shortage they were facing, knowing that if nomething was not done along these lines the County would go into the winter in just as bad a condition as they did last fail after the drought.

The igent, with the help of the Committees, had several meetings, having specialists from Blacksburg to help plan the program and it looked like a good year for Extension work in the County.

The Agent was very sorry the the Board of Supervisors out out the work when he resigned, as a new Agent could have helped the people in carrying out this plan which now will be dropped.

Where an agent part should be incorporated in the annual report of the agent and on that at the close of the rapper year, and the latter report so marked. Where two or more agents are employed in a county, each a leader of a line of work, statistics should not be duplicated.

At least four copies of the annual report should be made: One copy for the county officials, one copy for the state settings of office, and one copy for the Extension Service, initial States Department of Agriculture. To supplement the narrative part of the report, and in order that comparable State and National surface may be mide, it is necessary to include a statistical summary of the work in each county. The following form has been prepared to insure uniformity of reporting:

DEPINITIONS OF TRANS USED IN THIS REPORT

- A program of work is a statement of the specific lines of extension work to be undertaken by the extension agent intig a year or a period of years.
- 2. A plan of work is a definite outline of procedure for earrying out the different phases of the program of work. Such a plan provides specifically for the means to be used and the methods of using them. It also shows what, how much, when, and where the work is to be done.
- 2. A community is a more or less well-defined group of rural people with common interests and problems. Such a group may include those within a township, inche area, or similar limits. For the purpose of this report a community is one of the several units into which a county is divided for conducting organized extension work.
- 4. A project leader, tittal leader, or committeeman is a person who, because of special interest and fitness, is selected to serve as a leader in advancing come phase of the local extension program. A project leader may be either an organization or a subject-matter leader.
- 5. Demonstrations as contemplated in this report are of two kinds—method demonstrations and result demonstrations.
- A nettod demonstration is a demonstration from by an extension worker or other trained hather for the purpose of bearing here to carry out a practice. Examples: Demonstrations of how to can fruits and vegetables, ask open materials, of east positive.
- A next two constraints is a demonstration conducted by a former, home maker, boy, or gift under the direct ougavities of the extension switch, to drow leadly the value of a recommended practice. Both a domestration is neview as substantial period of time and records of results and comparisons, and is designed to seath others in addition to the person conducting the demonstration. Example: Demonstrating that the application of refutilise to cotton will result in more purificially yields, that underweight of certain children can be corrected through proper diet, or that the use of certained and in growing problems in a good investment.
 - The adoption of a farm or home practice resulting from a demonstration or other teaching activity employed by the stension worker as a means of teaching is not in itself a demonstration.
 - 4. A result demonstrator is an adult, boy, or girl who conducts a result demonstration as defined above.
- 7. A cooperator is a fariner or home maker who agrees to adopt certain recommended practices upon the solicitation of an extension worker. The work is not directly supervised by the extension agent and records are not required, but reports on the success of the practices may be obtained.
- 8. A 4-H Club is an organized group of boys and/or girls with the objectives of demonstrating improved practices in agriculture or home economics, and of providing desirable training for the members.
- 9. 4-H Club members enrolled are those boys and girls who actually start the work outlined for the year.
 - 16. 4-H Club members completing are those boys and girls who satisfactorily finish the work outlined for the year.
- A demonstration meeting is a meeting held to give a method demonstration or to start, inspect, or further a resummentation.
- 12. A training meeting is a meeting at which project leaders, local leaders, or committeemen are trained to carry on extension activities in their respective communities.
- 13. An office call is a call in person or by telephone by an individual or group seeking agricultural or home-economies information, as a result of which some definite assistance or information is given.
- 14. A farm or home visit is a call by the agent at a farm or home at which some definite information relating to extension work is given or obtained.
- 15. Days in office should include time spent by the county extension agent in his office, extension conferences, and any other work directly related to office administration.
 - 16. Days in field should include all days spent on official duty other than those spent in office.
 - 17. Letters written should include all original letters on official business. (Duplicated letters should not be included.)
- 18. An extension school is a school usually of two to six days' duration, arranged by the extension service, where practical instruction is given to persons not resident at the college. An extension short course differs from an extension short is usually for a longer period of time.
- 19. Records consist of definite information on file in the county office that will enable the agent to verify the data on extension work included in this report.
